

A Note from the Pastor!

I know that I preach about change quite a bit. Truth be told, there are many other topics I'd rather delve into, and yet so much is changing so rapidly in the world and in our lives that it's unavoidable. Children and adults alike lead highly scheduled lives, so much so that finding even an hour of spare time can be a challenge. A.l. is on the verge of upending so much of the work world. Super storms are now seasonal, leaving catastrophic damage in their wake. Churches are sliding further and further towards the sidelines of society. Though it can often seem overwhelming, I still believe that God holds creation in the palm of his hands and things will be ok. But, I believe that God calls us to be proactive in discerning the will of the Holy Spirit in the here and now. Indeed, we have the privilege of being co-creators with God in the holy work of building the Kingdom of God here on Earth. As tempting as it is to keep doing things the way we've always done them, in the end, it is wishful thinking. New problems require new solutions, but our goals of loving and serving all people and being a beacon of hope for our community remain the same as always.

Though it will take time, we trust that, with the help of the Spirit, we will identify faithful practices and structures that allow us to use our gifts and retain the life-giving energy of the church. And who knows what other new opportunities the Spirit is leading us to!
